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### Can students be seen on a regular basis? How often? What is the most often they can be seen?

Students must meet once at the beginning of the semester to get their accommodations identified. Other students come in occasionally. They don't routinely see students.

### Who works with the students? Professional Learning Disability People?

Students work with accommodation specialists who are professionals, and peer/graduate tutors.

### Who provides writing help? Peers? Professionals?

Tutors are provided by the departments, and can be peers or grad students.

### Who provides tutoring? Peers, grads, professionals, professors? Subject matter? Executive functioning (time management, organization)?

Subject matter tutors are provided by the departments, and can be peers or grad students. There is no central location for executive functioning assistance.

### Is there an added cost for services or a program?

### Do you have an added application for services or what is the process for obtaining services?

Documentation required for students with LD and or ADHD follows AHEAD guidelines. An added application is required for students with autism spectrum disorder and students with psychological conditions.

### Who is a good fit for your program or services?

Independent students that can self-advocate will do well.
